**T**hen an expert on the law stood up to test Jesus, saying, “Teacher, what must I do to get life forever?”  
<sup>26</sup>Jesus said, “What is written in the law? What do you read there?”  
<sup>27</sup>The man answered, “Love the Lord your God with all your heart, all your soul, all your strength, and all your mind.” Also, “Love your neighbor as you love yourself.”  
<sup>28</sup>Jesus said to him, “Your answer is right. Do this and you will live.”
