GOSPEL: Mark 10:17-31

P The Gospel according to Mark, the tenth chapter.P Glory to you, O Lord.

Narrator: When [Jesus] had traveled on, a young man came and knelt in the dust of the road in front of Jesus. Young Man: Good Teacher! What must I do to gain life in the world to come?
