- ²²⁻²³(When Araunah saw King David coming to his threshing floor) Araunah said, "Let my master the king take and sacrifice whatever he wants. Look, here's an ox for the burnt offering and threshing paddles and ox-yokes for fuel—Araunah gives it all to the king! And may God, your God, act in your favor."

²⁴⁻²⁵But the king said to Araunah, "No. I've got to buy it from you for a good price; I'm not going to offer God, my God, sacrifices that are no sacrifice."

So David bought the threshing floor and the ox, paying out fifty shekels of silver. He built an altar to God there and sacrificed burnt offerings and peace offerings. God was moved by the prayers and that was the end of the disaster.

HOLY GOSPEL: Luke 5:1-11

—The Message

- P The Holy Gospel according Luke, the fifth chapter.
- Glory to you, O Lord.
- Once when he was standing on the shore of Lake Gennesaret, the crowd was pushing in on him to better hear the Word of God. He noticed two boats tied up. The fishermen had just left them and were out scrubbing their nets. He climbed into the boat that was Simon's and asked him to put out a little from the shore. Sitting there, using the boat for a pulpit, he taught the crowd.

 4When he finished teaching, he said to Simon,
- "Push out into deep water and let your nets out for a catch."
- P 5-7Simon said,
- "Master, we've been fishing hard all night and haven't caught even a minnow. But if you say so, I'll let out the nets."
- It was no sooner said than done—a huge haul of fish, straining the nets past capacity. They waved to their partners in the other boat to come help them. They filled both boats, nearly swamping them with the catch.
 - ⁸⁻¹⁰ Simon Peter, when he saw it, fell to his knees before Jesus.
- "Master, leave. I'm a sinner and can't handle this holiness. Leave me to myself."
- When they pulled in that catch of fish, awe overwhelmed Simon and everyone with him. It was the same with James and John, Zebedee's sons, coworkers with Simon.

 10-11 Jesus said to Simon.
- "There is nothing to fear. From now on you'll be fishing for men and women."
- P They pulled their boats up on the beach, left them, nets and all, and followed him.
