—The Message

The first reading this morning is from the letter to the Hebrew Christians, the eleventh chapter.

E li's own sons were nothing but trouble. They didn't know God and could not have cared less about the customs of priests among the people. . . . ¹⁸⁻²⁰In the midst of all this, Samuel, a boy dressed in a priestly linen tunic, served God. Additionally, every year his mother would make him a little robe cut to his size and bring it to him when she and her husband came for the annual sacrifice.

^{2:6-9}After Joshua had dismissed them, the People of Israel went off to claim their allotted territories and take possession of the (promised) land. The people worshiped God throughout the lifetime of Joshua and the time of the leaders who survived him, leaders who had been in on all of God's great work that he had done for Israel. Then Joshua son of Nun, the servant of God, died. He was 110 years old . . .

¹⁰Eventually that entire generation died and was buried. Then another generation grew up that didn't know anything of God or the work he had done for Israel. ¹¹⁻¹⁵The People of Israel did evil in God's sight: they served Baal-gods; they deserted God, the God of their parents who had led them out of Egypt; they took up with other gods, gods of the peoples around them. They actually worshiped them! And oh, how they angered God as they worshiped god Baal and goddess Astarte!
