LESSONS

L This morning's lessons are about seven heroes who WENT when God said "Go!"

From Genesis 6-8: NOAH, oh, the places you'll GO!

^{6:12}God looked at the world and saw that the people were all living evil ...God told Noah, "GO build a boat, because a flood is coming. ⁷Then GO into the boat with your whole family and the animals and birds." Then the earth was flooded, but after things dried out ^{8:15}God said to Noah, ¹⁶"GO out of the boat with your family and the birds and animals with you. GO and multiply." ¹⁸So Noah did.

From Genesis 12: ABRAM [before God renamed him Abraham], oh, the places you'll GO!

- Good News Translation ¹The Lord had said to Abram, "GO from your country, your people and your father's household to the land I will show you. ²"I will make you into a great nation, and I will bless you; and all peoples on earth will be blessed through you." ⁴So Abram went.
- From Genesis 46: JACOB, oh, the places you'll GO!

I am sending you to Pharaoh to bring my people the Israelites out of Egypt. GO. Moses, be not afraid, I will be with you." So Moses went.
- From Ruth 1:8-16: **RUTH,** oh, the places you'll GO!
- ⁸Then Naomi said to her two daughters-in-law, "GO back, each of you, to your mother's home. May the Lord show you kindness, as you have shown kindness to me ... ⁹ ... Then Orpah kissed her mother-in-law goodbye, but Ruth clung to her. ¹⁶Ruth replied, "Don't urge me to leave you or to turn back from you. Where you GO I will GO, and where you stay I will stay. Your people will be my people and your God my God."
- From Isaiah 1:1-8: ISAIAH, oh, the places you'll GO!
- When Isaiah heard the voice of the Lord, saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will GO for us?" Isaiah responded, "Here am I; send me!" Then God said, "GO!" And Isaiah did.
- From Jonah 1 and 3: JONAH, oh, the places you'll GO!
- ¹One day the Lord said to Jonah, "GO to Nineveh and speak out against it; I am aware of how wicked its people are." ³Jonah, however, set out in the opposite direction
