PRELUDE: Turn Your Eyes Upon Jesus

Welcome to worship! Today's worship includes the sacrament of communion. Communion is offered by intinction: you may receive a wafer and dip it in the chalice with wine or white grape juice. Or you may pick up a prefilled communion "kit" on the altar rail as you approach the altar. Please tell an usher if you need a communion kit brought to you where you sit. At home you may prepare ahead of time wine/grape juice and bread appropriate for your family. Our liturgy declares we celebrate with "the church on earth and the hosts of heaven." We acknowledge that communion always connects us "remotely" and powerfully with the Church through time and space.

CALL TO WORSHIP

- **P** We hunger and thirst for God's wide welcome;
- We hunger and thirst for the healing of the hurting world;
- **P** We hunger and thirst for the grace of Christ's company in the people he gathers around his table;
- We hunger and thirst for the assurance of forgiveness Jesus so freely places in our empty hands.
- In the bread and wine of Holy Communion, God feeds this hunger and thirst. Holy Communion connects God's spoken announcement of forgiveness with the embodied actions of eating bread and drinking wine together. Receiving these elements of communion forms us into a body as well.
- Each time we receive communion together, God makes us a community of thanksgiving, created by the saving story and personal invitation of Jesus.
- It can be easy to doubt or dispute whether you saw or heard something correctly. Not so with eating and drinking. Even if you don't remember the details about what was on the menu or how the food was prepared, your body knows it has been fed.
- We find this whole-body fullness to be true in the promise and presence of Holy Communion.
 As with everyday eating and drinking, when it comes to this meal, a real body is always involved.

- **¹ HYMN OF THE DAY:** Look Who Gathers at Christ's Table
- 1 Look who gathers at Christ's table! Hear the stories that they bring. Some are weeping; some are laughing; some have songs they want to sing. Others ask why they're invited, burdened by the wrong they've done. Christ insists they all are welcome. There is room for ev'ryone.
- 2 Clouds of light surround the table; ancient followers appear, saints confessing how they wrestled with their guilt, their doubt and fear. Peter tells of his denying Christ was ever in his sight; Paul relates his fruitless efforts to obliterate the light.
- 3 Their sad stories are repeated in a thousand diff'rent ways, but they share one thing in common: they all end in thanks and praise for the host who has invited north and south and east and west to converge around this table, where all life is fed and blest.
- 4 Bring your joy and bring your sadness, and prepare to be surprised by the host whose hands are wounded, who will open wide your eyes when he blesses bread and breaks it—truth and manna from above! and then passes wine that wakens in your heart the taste of love.
