We Welcome LARRY PETERSON!

Larry Peterson officially joined the staff May 1 as Director or Worship and Music Ministries. His installation today is the culmination of a year's work by a dedicated team chaired by Karl Dietmeyer and Ben McCumber. Other team members included: Jennifer Archer, Rick Burnett, James Callison, Lauri Gambrel, Richard King, Don and Miki Stork, David and Sara Turk, Linda Volckmann, and Pastors Miriam and Fritz.

He comes to us from St. Stephen Lutheran Church, Urbandale, Iowa, where he was Director of Worship. Before that he was Director of Music at Immanuel Evangelical Lutheran Church, Watertown, Wisconsin, from 2018 to 2020, where members of his choir were Evan and Laura Dietmeyer Ferree! He was Director of Music at Grace Lutheran Church of Rock Hill, South Carolina, from 2016 to 2018. And for nearly fifteen years he was Director of Music for Campus Ministries and Instructor of Organ at Augustana College, Rock Island, Illinois (2001-2016).

Larry earned a Master of Music degree in Organ Performance from Eastman School of Music of the University of Rochester in 1984. His undergraduate degree was from Augustana College, *cum laude*, class of 1982. He has studied with distinguished organist/professors Russell Saunders, Paul Manz, Tom Robin Harris, H. Joseph Butler, Harald Vogel, Delbert Disselhorst, Greg Hand, and Jan Thompson.

Before beginning his formal college study, Larry started taking organ lessons at age 6 and held his first church position as organist at 13. He has served parishes as a full-time director of music in Brenham, Texas; Albert Lea, Minnesota; and Davenport, Iowa.

Larry is one of the founding members of the first board of directors for the Association of Lutheran Church Musicians. He has been invited to lead worship services and workshops for various Lutheran events sponsored through ALCM and other ELCA synodical bodies.

Larry has been dean of the Blackhawk Chapter of the American Guild of Organists (Iowa) and served as the convention chair the year that chapter hosted a regional convention. He has also been invited to Europe to give a series of organ concerts.



He was the founding director of RiverBend Bronze, an auditioned community handbell choir in the Quad City area. Within three years of their founding, they were invited to perform at two regional conventions of the Handbell Musicians of America and appeared as featured soloists for the Quad Cities Pops Christmas concert.

Larry also enjoys composing, especially for the church setting, and has pieces published by Kjos Music Publishers. He has also arranged several works for advanced handbell choirs for the concert setting.



Larry is married to April Peterson and enjoys woodworking, home improvement projects, riding his motorcycle, and spending time with his menagerie of cats and dogs.

We are grateful for all who helped Larry and April move into their new home in Jonesboro.
