THE LESSONS Sunday, January 28

FIRST READING: 1 Kings 6:1-2, 7, 18-20, 23, 28-32, 37

The first reading is from 1st Kings, the 6th chapter.

¹In the four hundred eightieth year after the Israelites came out of the land of Egypt, in the fourth year of Solomon's reign over Israel, in the month of Ziv, which is the second month, Solomon began to build the house of the LORD. ² The house that King Solomon built for the LORD was sixty cubits long, twenty cubits wide, and thirty cubits high.

- ¹⁸ The cedar within the house had carvings of gourds and open flowers; all was cedar; no stone was seen. ¹⁹ The inner sanctuary he prepared in the innermost part of the house, to set there the ark of the covenant of the LORD. ²⁰ The interior of the inner sanctuary was twenty cubits long, twenty cubits wide, and twenty cubits high; he overlaid it with pure gold. He also overlaid the altar with cedar.
- 23 In the inner sanctuary he made two cherubim of olivewood, each ten cubits high . . . it was ten cubits from the tip of one wing to the tip of the other. 28 He also overlaid the cherubim with gold.
- ²⁹ He carved the walls of the house all around about with carved engravings of cherubim, palm trees, and open flowers, in the inner and outer rooms. ³⁰ The floor of the house he overlaid with gold, in the inner and outer rooms.
- ³¹ For the entrance to the inner sanctuary he made doors of olivewood; the lintel and the doorposts were five-sided. ³² He covered the two doors of olivewood with carvings of cherubim, palm trees, and open flowers; he overlaid them with gold and spread gold on the cherubim and on the palm trees.
- ³⁷ The house was finished in all its parts and according to all its specifications. Solomon was seven years in building it.
