GOSPEL: Mark 1:21-28

- P The Holy Gospel according to Mark, the 1st chapter. Glory to you, O Lord.
- P 21 They came *at last* to the village of Capernaum *on the Sea of Galilee*; and on the Sabbath Day, Jesus went straight into a synagogue, *sat down*, and began to teach.
- The people *looked at each other*, amazed, because this strange teacher acted as One authorized *by God, and what He taught affected them* in ways their own scribes and teachers could not.
- II 23 Just then a man in the gathering who was overcome by an unclean spirit shouted.
- Unclean Spirit: ²⁴ What are You doing here, Jesus of Nazareth? Have You come to destroy us? I can see who You are! You're the Holy One of God.
- **I** Jesus (rebuking him): ²⁵ Be quiet and come out of him NOW!
- The man's body began to shake and shudder; and then, howling, the spirit flew out of the man.

 The people couldn't stop talking about what they had seen.
- **Who is this Jesus?** What on earth has happened? This new teacher has authority behind his teaching. Even the unclean spirits obey His commands!
- P 28 It wasn't long before news of Jesus spread over the countryside of Galilee.
