THE LESSONS Sunday, February 2

FIRST READING: Join me in reading various Bible verses on God's creation. Please read the portion in bold:

The Lord God took the man and put him in the Garden of Eden

to work it and take care of it. — Genesis 2:15

The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of his hands.

Day after day they pour forth speech; night after night they reveal knowledge. — Psalm 19:1-2

The earth is the Lord's,

and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it. — Psalm 24:1

GOSPEL: Matthew 6:26-33

- P The Holy Gospel according to Matthew, the 6th chapter. Glory to you, O Lord.
 - ²⁶ Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they? ²⁷ Can any one of you by worrying add a single hour to your life? ²⁸ "And why do you worry about clothes? See how the flowers of the field grow.
