SECOND READING: Psalm 104:10-18

The second reading is from 104th Psalm.

- 10 The Lord makes springs pour water into the ravines; it flows between the mountains.
- ¹¹ They give water to all the beasts of the field; the wild donkeys quench their thirst.
- 12 The birds of the sky nest by the waters; they sing among the branches.
- He waters the mountains from his upper chambers; the land is satisfied by the fruit of his work.
- He makes grass grow for the cattle, and plants for people to cultivate—bringing forth food from the earth:
- wine that gladdens human hearts, oil to make their faces shine,

and bread that sustains their hearts.

GOSPEL: Matthew 6:26-33

- P The Holy Gospel according to Matthew, the 6th chapter. Glory to you, O Lord.
 - ²⁶ Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they? ²⁷ Can any one of you by worrying add a single hour to your life? ²⁸ "And why do you worry about clothes? See how the flowers of the field grow. They do not labor or

They do not labor or spin. ²⁹ Yet I tell you that not even Solomon in all his splendor was dressed like one of these. ³⁰ If that is how God clothes the grass of the field, which is here today and tomorrow is thrown into the fire, will he not much more clothe you—you of little faith? ³¹ So do not worry, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' ³² For the pagans run after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them. ³³ But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.
