

June 1974, Pastor John Weber arrives in Peachtree City as a mission developer.

December 1, 1974, First worship service.

February 1975, Charter established.

April 1975, Land purchased for the first unit.

June 8, 1975, Christ Our Shepherd Lutheran Church officially organized. Service led by Bishop Harvey Huntley.

October 5, 1975, Pastor John Weber installed as first pastor of Christ Our Shepherd.

June 25, 1978, Church facility completed and dedicated.

July 15, 1989, Rev. Eleanor Russey installed as first Associate Pastor.

July 1989, Mr. Jim Russey became Director of Music.

1991, COS Preschool established.

1998, Rev. Miriam Beecher becomes second Associate Pastor.

1998, Rev. David Beecher becomes Minister of Music.

1999, Fellowship Hall and Education Wing dedicated.

June 27, 2008, Pastor John Weber retires.

September 12, 2010, Pastor Fritz Wiese is installed as Senior Pastor.

November 2022, David Beecher retires.

May 2023, Larry Peterson begins as Director of Worship and Music.

April 15, 2024, Pastor Miriam Beecher retires.
