Welcome to our Love Feast!

It is our prayer that this Love Feast will focus your season on God's unconditional love for us in sending his Son to be born in a manger. We are grateful for your presence. May God bless you richly.

So What Exactly is a Love Feast?

The Love Feast is an ancient observance, dating from the early days of the Christian Church. You may find it mentioned in Acts, Chapter 2. It is a simple meal of the faithful in a service of worship.

Love Feasts are a cherished tradition of the Moravian Church. Love Feasts are a religious service of fellowship that combines a simple meal with music, scripture readings, and hymns. It is a revival of the early Christian "agape" or love feasts and is characterized by simplicity, dignity, and musical devotion. Singing is a vital part of the service. Hymns, carols, and songs are used to convey the message of the day, and choirs may perform anthems. The singing is incorporated into the service as the meal is shared. A basic, easily shared meal is a central feature. In many traditions, this is a sweet bun or cookie and coffee, tea or occasionally, an alternative beverage.

The Moravian Church and the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America established full-communion ties in 1999, affirming their kinship in Christ. Christ Our Shepherd has offered Love Feasts since 2003.

During this service there is a time to eat a roll with hot apple cider (or juice), and to light a beeswax candle. We will have participated in the blessing prior to being served. You may partake of the buns and drinks when they are served so that the hot beverage does not have a chance to cool.

Caution: The candle you will be offered is made of beeswax, and should not drip as much as a regular candle. However, we ask that you take some precautions in the interest of safety:

1. **Children under 12 must not handle lit candles;** they will be given battery-powered candles.
2. Keep the candle close to you at all times to prevent contact with another person.
3. Please hold your candle upright at all times.
4. When you extinguish your candle, please blow gently so the wax does not splatter.

Hold it upright for 1 minute after you extinguish it to allow the wax to harden.

If you choose not to keep your candle, please return it to a basket in the Narthex.
